THIS WEEKEND'S GAMES

The Killer Bees (9-23-6, 24 pts.) continue their six-game road trip with games at Corpus Christi (15-18-5, 35 pts.) and Bossier-Shreveport (26-7-4, 56 pts.). Rio is winless in nine games (0-8-1) entering the weekend and is 1-13-4 on the road. The Bees have fallen five points behind third-place Austin in the Southeast Division. The Bees enter the weekend 11 points out of the final playoff spot, occupied by the Rayz, in the Southern Conference.

Corpus Christi faces a three-in-three weekend, facing Laredo and Rio at home before traveling to Texas to battle the Brahmas at 3:05 p.m. on Sunday. The Rayz have dropped two of three entering the weekend but sandwiched a 4-0 shut out over Laredo into that stretch.

Bossier-Shreveport returns home for a pair of games after traveling to Oklahoma City on Friday. The Bugs host Laredo on Saturday before welcoming the Bees on Sunday. The Bugs enter the weekend leading the Northeast Division by nine points over Mississippi. They have won 16 of 17 and had a 15-game winning streak snapped in 3-2 SOL at Youngstown on Jan. 20.

OVERVIEW

The Killer Bees are currently on a six-game road swing with stops in Texas, Amarillo, Rocky Mountain, Colorado, Corpus Christi and Bossier-Shreveport. The team will bus back to the Valley after Wednesday's game in Colorado, then leave for Corpus Christi on Saturday. Rio is still looking for its' second road win of the season.

Rio's power play has steadily improved through each 10-game segment this season while the PK has steadily declined. LONG DECEMBER

The Bees closed out a tough December in which the team won just one game (1-7-3). A five-game road trip in the middle of the month produced one point (a 4-3 OTL at Amarillo). Rio was outscored 67-32 in December and allowed 476 shots (43.2 average). As such, the goaltending struggled, producing a 6.09 goals against average to go along with a save percentage of .859. The Bees finished minus-119 for the month.

GET THE FIRST GOAL?

The Bees are 2-9-5 when scoring first this season and 7-14-1 when allowing opponents to score first. Rio is 45-10-4 in the past two seasons (2005-06, 06-07) when scoring first. Conversely, they are 16-44-9 when allowing the first goal. Around the league this season (as of Jan. 18), the team that scores first is 176-79-31, or wins 61.5% of the time. Teams that score first have earned 31OT points, which brings the percentage of scoring first and getting at least a point to 72.3%. Last season teams that scored first were 364-128-52, or won 66.9% of the time.

NEW MEXICO STINGS BEES FOR FRANCHISE RECORDS

The Bees 10-3 loss at New Mexico and 8-1 loss at Arizona were the largest margin of defeat in a regular season game. The team also allowed a franchise record seven first period goals (most in any period). New Mexico's Konrad Reeder set opponent records for most points and assists in one game (six). He fell one helper shy of tying a CHL record for assists in a game.

AMARILLO SETS OPPONENT RECORD FOR SHOTS, TWICE

Amarillo's 60 shots against on Dec. 14 were a regular season record, as were Jeff Van Nynatten's 56 saves. Laredo pasted Van Nynatten with 61 in a playoff game on March 30, 2007, in which Van Nynatten made an overall team record 58 saves in a 4-3 win at the LEC. The Apes' off-ice crew credited the Gorillas with 64 shots on Jan. 18, setting an opponent high for the Bees, Dave Lemanowicz made a franchise-record and CHL season-high 59 stops. The CHL record for saves in a game is 69, set by Bryan Elder of Austin on Feb. 13, 1999.

AUSTIN SETS OPPONENT RECORD FOR FASTEST GOALS

Austin scored eight seconds apart (14:51, John Ronan and 14:59, Henry Kuster) on Dec. 8, setting the record for fastest two goals by an opponent.

ONE GOAL BEES

RGV is 5-3-6 in one goal games this season.

FOUR SCORE AND MORE

The Bees are 6-3-1 when scoring four or more goals and 2-1-0 when scoring six or more.
