### ***THIS WEEKEND'S GAMES***

The Killer Bees (16-35-7, 39 pts.) travel to Odessa on Thursday to face the Jackalopes (30-22-7, 67 pts.) for the final time this season before returning home for two games against the Austin Ice Bats (25-32-2, 52 pts). This is the second week in a row the Bees play a three-in-three set. Overall the Bees are in a seven games in nine days stretch. So far, they are 2-2.

Rio fell 7-3 to Bossier Shreveport in Tuesday's Kid's Day game to effectively eliminate the Bees from playoff contention. Amarillo's 6-2 win over Tulsa on Tuesday and Austin's 4-1 win at Corpus Christi last night finished the job. The Bees can still play spoiler. Of the team's six remaining games, they face Austin and Laredo twice, Corpus Christi once and Odessa once. Odessa is in the hunt for the Southwest Division title and is currently five points off the lead with four games left after tonight. Austin is battling Amarillo for the No. 5 seed in the South, while Corpus Christi enters the weekend five points off the pace.

#### **Vs. Odessa**

- ▶ Odessa has lost five in a row...their final four games after tonight are against Corpus Christi, Amarillo and Arizona (2).
- ▶ This is the third and final meeting between the teams. The Jacks won the first match up 3-0 on Nov. 9; Rio took the second meeting 4-2 on Feb. 26
- ▶ Odessa's Sebastien Thinel (76) and Dominic Leveille (75) are 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> in CHL scoring..
- ▶ Goalie Alex Vincent is third in shutouts (4) and save percentage (.924)

#### **Vs. Austin**

- ▶ Goalie Miguel Beaudry is fifth in saves (1121) and save percentage (.917).
- ▶ The Bats' Mike Bartlett enters the weekend tied for 7<sup>th</sup> in rookie scoring (17-26-43).
- ▶ Austin's 4-1 win at Corpus Christi on Wednesday gave the Bats a five-point separation from the Rayz.
- ▶ Austin and Amarillo face off on March 20 in a game that could decide the division. It will be the 63<sup>rd</sup> game of the season for Austin while Amarillo will still have two games (vs. New Mexico).

- **THE LATEST MOVES** --- Mark O'Leary was signed to a PTO by Grand Rapids on March 12...Dennis Maxwell was suspended by the CHL for two games on March 9...D Tyler Fuller was waived on Feb. 14 and F Jason Weitzel was signed... F Jason Weitzel was acquired on Feb. 13 in exchange for D Jon Hedberg...Robin Big Snake was suspended by the CHL for one game on Jan. 27...Goalie A.J. Bucchino was signed on Jan. 18
- **O'LEARY SCORES TWICE IN AHL DEBUT** --- Mark O'Leary made his AHL debut on March 12 and scored two goals in a 7-1 Grand Rapids win over Toronto. O'Leary, who flew in to Grand Rapids the day of the game starting with a 6:30 a.m. flight out of McAllen, was named the No. 3 star of the game and finished with a plus-3 rating.
- **WHO'S HOT?** --- Josh Bonar has points (2-2-4) in three straight ...Travis Banga has points (4-6-10) in eight of 11 games...Jason Weitzel has goals in three straight (3-2-5)...Lance Herauf has points in four of five games (2-3-5)
- **500 CAREER POINTS FOR MAXWELL** - Dennis Maxwell's second assist (on Mike Tuomi's game-winner) at Odessa on Feb. 26 was the 500<sup>th</sup> regular season point of his career. He needs two assists for 300 in his career. Maxwell accomplished the feat in his 665<sup>th</sup> regular season game. In 104 games as a Bee to that point, he posted 100 points (30-70-100).
- **100 GAMES AS A BEE FOR VOLTERA** - Rio's 4-2 win at Odessa on Feb. 26 was Rob Voltera's 100<sup>th</sup> game as a Bee. In those 100 games, he posted 107 points (47-60-107) and 255 PIM in those games.
- **100 GAMES FOR CHMIEL, HERAUF** - Bernie Chmiel played in his 100<sup>th</sup> pro game on Feb. 26 at Odessa. Lance Herauf played in his 100<sup>th</sup> pro game on Friday, Feb. 15 at Austin.
- **GOAL HUNT** --- Josh Bonar had not scored in 17 games, dating back to his Jan. 8 hat trick until deflecting home his 17<sup>th</sup> goal on Feb. 26... Jeremy Van Hoof's shorthanded goal on Feb. 29 was his first since Dec. 28, a span of 27 games...Nick Warriner has gone 28 games without a goal, dating back to Dec. 31.
- **BONAR BACK** --- Josh Bonar returned to the lineup on Feb. 23 after being scratched on Feb. 22. He ended an 11-game scoreless drought with an assist on Rob Voltera's third period goal.
- **300<sup>th</sup> REGULAR SEASON GAME FOR BEES** --- The 300<sup>th</sup> game in franchise history took place Thursday, Feb. 21 at Austin.
- **HOLY SHOTS AND PANTS** --- The Killer Bees have been out-shot in 47 of 58 games this season. They are 4-4-0 when outshooting their opponents and 1-2-0 when shots are even.
- **BEES VS. DIVISIONS** --- Rio is 12-16-4 vs. Southeast Division teams this season and 4-7-1 vs. Southwest Division rivals. The Bees are 0-12-2 vs. the Northern Conference.
- Rio's all time record stands at **128-150-32 (13 OTL-19 SOL)** (310 games played).

**Should two (2) or more teams be tied in points for any seeding issue throughout the playoffs, the following tiebreakers will be used:** Most wins, then head-to-head record, then goals for and against differential.

#### 2007-2008 Playoff Format

The 2007-2008 Central Hockey League playoff format is as follows:

- A total of **ten (10) of seventeen (17) teams** will qualify for the post-season, **consisting of five (5) clubs from each conference**. Each of the **four (4) division regular season champions** (Northwest, Northeast, Southwest and Southeast) will be seeded either 1st or 2nd in their conference heading into the playoffs based on point totals. **The next three (3) highest teams in each conference's** regular season standings based on point totals, regardless of division, will be seeded 3rd, 4th and 5th in each conference and will also qualify for post-season play.
- **The playoffs will consist of four (4) rounds.** (Conference Quarter-Finals – Best of 3, Conference Semi-Finals – Best of 7, Conference Finals – Best of 7, Ray Miron President's Cup Finals – Best of 7).
- **The opening round (Conference Quarter-Finals) will feature one (1) separate series of play in each conference, with the 4th seed playing the 5th seed.** Both Conference Quarter-Finals series must be completed no later than the first Thursday after the completion of the regular season.
- The second round (Conference Semi-Finals) will consist of the victorious two (2) teams from each conference's opening round, along with the top three (3) seeds in each conference. The 1st seed will play the winner of the first round series, and the 2nd seed will play the 3rd seed in each conference.
- The third round (Conference Finals) will consist of the victorious two (2) teams remaining from each conference, with Conference Semi-Final seeding remaining in effect to determine home ice advantage.
- The fourth round (President's Cup Final) will consist of the victorious two (2) teams remaining, one from each conference. Home ice advantage in the Ray Miron President's Cup Finals will be awarded to the club with the higher regular season point total, regardless of any earlier playoff seeding.

### Lemanowicz

- **LAST WIN:** Feb. 15, 2008 at Austin...made 53 saves in a 5-2 win.
- Set a franchise record and CHL season high with 59 saves in a 5-3 loss at Amarillo on Jan. 19. The CHL record for saves in a game is 69, set by Bryan Elder of Austin on Feb. 13, 1999.
- Prior to Friday, Dec. 7, was 0-4-1 in his previous five starts with a 3.38 GAA and .910 save percentage...had faced 38 or more shots in four of his last five outings.
